


Introduction

The **CARE-GET** project (**Collaborative Advancement for Renewed Education, Generation, Economy and Technology Transition**) has been chosen as one of the 22 most innovative projects in the second call for Innovative Actions of the European Urban Initiative (EUI). This project has a total budget of 5,009,480 euros. This achievement positions the Municipality of Haskovo alongside renowned cities such as Barcelona, Bologna, Athens, and Rotterdam. The project is distinctive for its integration of health, care, and nature, combining education, technology, and innovation to create new jobs and strengthen the local economy.

The CARE-GET project aims to transform the abandoned building of the former orphanage in Haskovo into a MedTech Hub, which will include a telemedicine center. This hub will feature multifunctional spaces designed to attract, retain, and develop local talent. Shared workspaces and a digital corner will foster social integration and lifelong learning. Additionally, the building will include a wellness area, and the surrounding space will be designed with nature-based solutions. The center will host a variety of events and activities that bring together different generations and economic sectors, promoting both the physical and mental well-being of Haskovo residents while enhancing community ties and preserving the city's cultural heritage.

CARE-GET will commence on December 1, 2024, and run until May 31, 2028. Throughout this period, comprehensive studies, economic analyses, and strategies for the labor market and economic development of Haskovo will be conducted and executed. This project is being carried out by an international consortium comprising five countries: Bulgaria, Romania, Lithuania, Greece, and Italy. Representatives from these nations will collaborate to develop innovative solutions and transfer successful practices to other cities within the EU.



04 Baseline study on Haskovo labour market and Skills Gaps Analysis Report

The baseline study evaluates the economy and labor market in Haskovo Municipality by examining the workforce, industrial presence, and investment trends. The analysis covers the period from 2021 to 2023, with no data available for 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Data was collected from official sources and through surveys conducted with employers and workers across various sectors.

Key insights and recommendations from the analysis

Haskovo experienced consistent economic growth from 2021 to 2023; however, it faces several challenges, including demographic issues, a shortage of skilled labor, and low levels of foreign investment. Wages in the region are below the national average, particularly in the manufacturing sector. To overcome these obstacles, active policies are necessary to attract investment, modernize businesses, and promote high-tech industries. Key steps include improving working conditions, stimulating local entrepreneurship, and aligning education with the needs of the economy. With timely and effective actions, Haskovo has the potential to become a significant economic center in the region.

Conclusions

Recommendations

- Lack of adequately qualified personnel in various sectors, especially in technical fields and healthcare.
- ***** Mismatch between education and labor market.
- Low average wages leading to migration of skilled personnel to larger economic centers.
- Shortage of medical personnel, which leads to increased workloads and reduced quality of health services.
- Lack of systematic efforts to develop digital skills among personnel, which puts Haskovo at risk of falling behind in industrial modernization.

To ensure effective planning and implementation of development strategies, it is essential to enhance coordination among local administration, businesses, and educational institutions.

For future improvement, strategic measures should focus on attracting and retaining qualified personnel, adopting technological innovations, and enhancing working conditions through economic incentives and educational reforms.
